COMMITTEE'S REPORT.

To the Contributors, Subscribers,
Life Governors, and Annual Governors.

Although the number of in-patients greatly increased, the financial situation has not drifted. The gross income shows an increase of £169, and the expenditure an increase of £999. These figures are indicative that the increased efficiency of the Hospital meets with the approval of the contributing public.

PATIENTS.

The number of in-patients treated was 784 (439 males and 345 females)—an increase of 130 over last year. The daily average was 44.35, against 40.55 shown in the previous report. Out-patients receiving treatment totalled 388, while the total attendances were 1016. The Infectious Diseases Hospital has been open for the greater part of the year, the total number of cases treated being 57.

HONORARY MEDICAL STAFF.

During the year Dr. E. J. Connell, who had been one of the Honorary Medical Staff for about 30 years, passed away, leaving behind him a record of untiring service on behalf of the Hospital. To him and to the other members of the Honorary Staff the Committee and patients are deeply grateful. Dr. A. E. Brauer completed his term as Resident Medical Officer, and Dr. William Loftus was appointed to the vacancy.

NURSING STAFF.

Matron McKenzie resigned during the year, and Miss N. M. Griffiths was appointed to the vacancy. Sisters M. M. Drummond and L. Wheeler were appointed Sisters, in lieu of Sisters A. O'Brien and T. Hance, who resigned to do post-graduate work. Nurses M. H. Buchanan, R. A. Stewart, C. M. Malone, and L. Adams succeeded in passing their final examinations. The Hospital now having the necessary daily average, three years' training suffices for the Nurses, and there is no dearth of applicants.

RETIRING OFFICERS.

The following City members of Committee retire by effluxion of time, and are eligible for re-election, viz.:—Messrs. H. H. Smith, H. J. Worland, J. P. McMeekin, W. Robinson, and R. C. Stanley. Mr. Wm. Lindsay, a Country member, also retires, and is eligible for re-election. There are also three vacancies on the country committee to be filled.

LADIES' AUXILIARIES.

The services being rendered by the members of the Ladies' Auxiliaries are greatly appreciated by the Committee. Their efforts save the institution quite a large amount in the way of commodities; but, in addition, the interest created and the stimulus given by their self-sacrifice works for the good of the Hospital in other ways. Auxiliaries are an integral part of a modern hospital, especially where the efforts are co-ordinated. Jam Day and Egg Day were both successful, and an extension of the former might lead to a whole year's supply being donated.

COUNTRY DISTRICT QUOTAS.

This system of organised effort, inaugurated recently, has been considerably extended, with gratifying success. There is every hope

during this year of additional areas joining up. This method of contribution assures a regular and systematised income, and leaves to the various districts their own methods of raising their quotas. The Committee greatly appreciate what has been done, and will at all times be pleased to co-operate.

NEW BUILDINGS AND EQUIPMENT.

The scheme for remodelling and rebuilding, inaugurated in 1921, is now nearing completion, and it is expected that the official opening will take place either late in September or early in October. Originally estimated to cost less than £20,000, ideas have been so enlarged that on completion the total cost will be approximately £35,000. Funds are in hand to meet the major portion of commitments. A ready response on the Opening Day should free the Committee from embarrassment. The aim has been to bring the Hospital right up to modern requirements. The Operating Theatre has been equipped on up-to-date lines. The X-ray plant is capable of all kinds of work. The new Children's and Maternity Wards should confer a great boon to the community. Taken as a whole, the scheme when it stands complete will reflect credit on the City and District, and will compare favorably with any hospital outside the metropolis. There should be no serious call for capital expenditure for some years. The next advance will be along Community Hospital lines, but when that stage is reached probably other means than an appeal will be adopted for capital costs.

GENERAL.

Special donations for the year were:—Ball organised by the ladies of the Red Cross and the A.N.A., £62/14/-; Municipal Band, £38/14/-; Anonymous (per Mr. J. Fairley), £20; Warrnambool Racing Club Summer Meeting, £31/0/8; MacRobertson, £5; Howard Smith, £5. The bequests were:—Edward Wilson Charitable Fund, £60; Alfred Felton Bequest, £100; J. W. Anderson's Estate, £30 13/8; P. Brennan Estate, £40; Jos. Khroneimer Estate, £5.

The employees of many Warrnambool and District firms are now giving systematically, and to all such the Committee tenders grateful thanks, the amount subscribed in this way being £601.

The Wireless Installation is another much appreciated addition to the Hospital's equipment. It will prove a great boon and source of enjoyment to those who are forced aside on beds of sickness.

Intimation of several bequests have been received during the year. The late Thomas Burden bequeathed one-sixth of the residue of his estate. The late Elizabeth Davis a legacy of £200; the late Alexander Brown the sum of £50, and the late James Bennie a legacy subject to some life interests. It is hoped that City and District testators, when making their wills, will not overlook the needs of the institution.

To the Press and to all others who have rendered service of any kind, and who may have been overlooked, we offer our thanks and appreciation.
