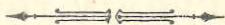

## COMMITTEE'S REPORT.

To the Life Governors and Contributors,  
Warrnambool District Hospital.

LADIES AND GENTLEMEN,—

The Committee of Management have pleasure in submitting for your approval the Seventy-third Annual Report and Statement of Accounts, duly audited, for the year ending 30th June, 1927.

### FINANCE.

The year commenced with an overdraft of £763/8/-, and closed with a credit balance of £271/17/4, thus showing that the revenue exceeded the expenditure by £1035/5/4.

### ADMISSIONS.

654 (375 males, 279 females) In-Patients received treatment during the past twelve months, being an increase of 101 over the preceding year. Infectious cases numbered 12, and 4 remained on the 30th June, 1927. The daily average was 40.55, and the cost per bed £107/18/3.

### HONORARY MEDICAL OFFICERS.

To Drs. E. J. Connell, J. H. Henderson, H. I. Holmes, A. H. Dunstan, F. E. Littlewood, and J. F. Patrick, special thanks are again due for their loyal and valuable services to the institution.

### RESIDENT MEDICAL OFFICER.

Dr. E. A. Daley resigned during the year and Dr. E. H. Robinson, who was elected to the position, also resigned. The vacancy was filled by the appointment of Dr. A. E. Brauer.

The following members retire by effluxion of time and are eligible for re-election:—Messrs. Jas. Dickson, J. King, and H. H. Castles. It will also be necessary to fill one vacancy.

Messrs. D. O'Keefe (Winslow) and W. A. Anderson (Allansford), also retire by effluxion of time and are eligible for re-election. There are also two vacancies to be filled.

Matron Paton resigned during the year, and Matron McKenzie was appointed in her stead.

Nurses A. Hamilton, V. Collins, S. Hance, and S. Hall were successful in passing their R.V.T.N.A. examination.

Mr. and Mrs. T. Burden, Misses H. Cameron and E. Atchison, and Messrs. R. J. Jones (Cooramook), G. B. Nicol (Grasmere), Robert Askew (Ballangeich), G. S. Mackay, W. J. Campbell (Woodford), and Cr. W. J. Ross (Grasmere), were elected Life Governors to the institution.

The organising scheme has proved successful in disposing of the maintenance overdraft and replacing same with a credit balance.

The stone work of the George Rolfe Theatre Block is nearing completion and the other work progressing satisfactorily.

### "JEAN BUICK SALTAU MATERNITY WARD."

A generous donation of £500 has been received from the Hon. M. Saltau, M.L.C., for the purpose of remodelling the Female Ward, which afterwards will be known as the "Jean Buick Saltau Maternity Ward."

### WARRNAMBOOL AND DISTRICT RED CROSS AUXILIARIES.

The value of the work done by the above is plainly to be seen in the reduction of the maintenance account.

To the members of the City Auxiliary, Allansford, Allan's Forest, Wangoom, Grasmere, Panmure and other centres, the Committee extend their warm and appreciative thanks for the commendable work done by them in the interests of suffering humanity.

The Egg Day again brought in a bountiful supply, for which we thank the donors, also Mr. H. H. Smith for supervising, testing, and laying down same.
