COMMITTEE'S REPORT.

To the Life Governors and Contributors,
Warrnambool District Hospital.

LADIES AND GENTLEMEN,—

The Committee of Management have pleasure in submitting for your approval the seventy-second Annual Report and Statement of Accounts, duly audited, for the year ending 30th June, 1926.

FINANCE.

The Maintenance Account opened with a Dr. Balance of £778/5/10, and closed with a Dr. of £768/8/-. The daily average was 37.75, and the cost per bed £116/14/3 $\frac{1}{2}$.

ADMISSION TO HOSPITAL.

553 (287 males and 266 females) In-patients received treatment during the past twelve months, being an increase of 60 over the preceding year. Infectious cases were comparatively few, one patient only remains in isolation on 30th June, 1926.

HONORARY MEDICAL OFFICERS.

To Drs. E. J. Connell, J. H. Henderson, H. I. Holmes, A. H. Dunstan, F. E. Littlewood, and J. F. Patrick, special thanks are due for their valuable services to the Institution.

RESIDENT MEDICAL OFFICER.

Dr. J. G. Barnaby resigned during the year, and Dr. E. A. Daley was appointed to fill the vacancy.

The following members retire by effluxion of time, and are eligible for re-election :—Messrs. G. S. Mackay and J. Mainland, During the year Mr. L. Crawley and Mr. C. Rooney resigned. The Committee very much regret having lost the services of these two highly esteemed and valued members. It will be necessary to fill the vacancies.

Messrs. T. W. Crothers, D. O'Keefe, W. W. Johnstone and W. A. Anderson also retire by effluxion of time, and are eligible for re-election. It will also be necessary to fill three vacancies.

Nurses Daley and Dalton were successful in passing their R.V.T.N.A. examination.

Mrs. Jean Reeves, Laang; Mr. W. Henderson, Grasmere; and Mr. Williams, Winslow, were appointed Life Governors to the Institution.

After having filled the Presidential chair for nearly twenty years the Hon. M. Saltau, M L.C., owing to his removal to Melbourne, resigned from that position, but still retains a seat as a member of the Committee. Mr. Saltau's large experience, untiring energy and zeal, combined with his liberality, has done much to make the Hospital what it is.

Mr. J. E. Vines, who has been a Country Member of Committee for many years, has transferred his interest to the Camperdown Hospital. We are grateful to Mr. Vines for past services rendered to this Institution.

Our best thanks are due to Mr. T. J. Rome, the energetic Secretary of the Western District Show Exhibits, for his interest and enthusiasm in raising the handsome sum of Sixty-three Pounds Seventeen Shillings and Eightpence (£63/17/8) for the Hospital.

During the year we were honored by a visit from Dr. McEachern, the American authority on hospital work; Dr. Argyle, Minister of Health; Dr. Marshall Hall; and the Inspector of Charities, Mr. R. J. Love. After having made a general inspection, the visiting expert was greatly surprised to find that the Committee were working on well-defined lines, and he did not know of a place in his own country where such was done. It appeared to him that those who were responsible for the working out of the policy did better than they knew. The system was a splendid one, and he advised them to continue on the same lines.

The remodelling scheme is being proceeded with, and it is hoped that before long the base standard requirements will be attained.

MARKET DAY AND QUEEN CARNIVAL.

The keen enthusiasm displayed throughout the competition, resulting in over four thousand pounds (£4000) being added to the funds of the institution, reflects great credit on all who assisted in the undertaking. OBITUARY.

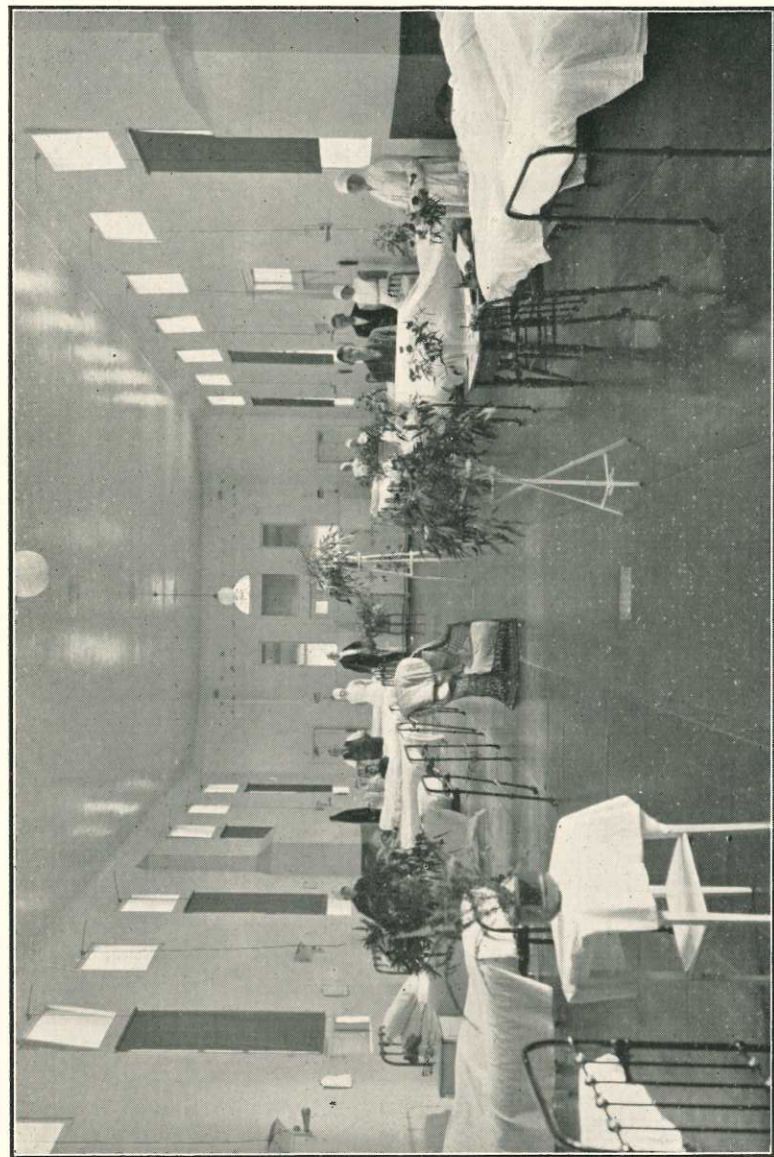
