## COMMITTEE'S REPORT.



To the Life Governors and Contributors,  
Warrnambool District Hospital.

LADIES AND GENTLEMEN,

The Committee of Management have pleasure in submitting for your approval the annual report and statement of accounts duly audited for the year ending, 30th June, 1925.

### FINANCE

The year commenced with an overdraft of £627/11/11 and closed with a dr. balance of £778/5/10. The daily average was 35.3 and the cost per bed £120/0/10½. Maintenance finance is causing your committee some anxiety, and an endeavour will be made to organize the district, so as to ensure a steady flow of income to meet requirements.

The scheme for rebuilding and remodelling has proceeded apace during the twelve months. The Nurses home, laundry and two wards, together with many minor details have been completed at a total cost of approximately £17,000. To complete the scheme at least another £10,000 is required of which one half must come from the district public.

### ADMISSION TO HOSPITAL.

493 in-patients (265 males and 228 females) received treatment during the year. There was an increase of 41 admissions as compared with 1924-25. It is pleasing to note that infectious cases were comparatively few, and the Infectious Quarters at the present time are closed.

### HONORARY MEDICAL OFFICERS.

To Drs. E. J. Connell, J. H. Henderson, H. I. Holmes, A. H. Dunstan, F. E. Littlewood, and J. F. Patrick special thanks are due for their loyal and valuable services to the institution.

### RESIDENT MEDICAL OFFICER.

Dr. J. G. Cameron resigned during the year, the vacancy being filled by Dr. Barnaby.

Dr. Holmes was granted six months holiday to visit the old land. Mr. A. Robinson resigned during the year, owing to his Melbourne business requiring extra attention. In Mr. Robinson the Committee lose a highly esteemed and valuable member of long standing.

Special donations from the following were gratefully received: E. Wilson charitable fund. Warrnambool Racing Club, A. Felton bequest, estate late J. R. Macpherson, estate late P. Brennan, Winslow Contribution per Mr. W. Williams, Grasmere Contribution per Capt. Jenkins, Panmure Contributions per Messrs Worland and Crawley, Messrs C. J. G. Gordon, G. Oliver, E. L. Johnstone, J. Fox, and Miss A. G. Gordon.

During the year a Red Cross Auxiliary was formed, this supplies a long felt want, and excellent work is being done. The jam day organised by the Society meet with a most generous response, resulting in about half a ton of jam being sent to the Hospital. Every Thursday afternoon, a number of ladies meet and are most enthusiastic in the work of making garments, mending, etc. Steps have been taken to awaken an interest in some of the Country Centres. Panmure Society has forwarded materials etc. on many occasions and a branch will shortly be formed at Grasmere.

The Junior Red Cross Societies working amongst the country schools, deserve our best thanks for their kindly interest in the Institution, having supplied groceries etc.

The Annual Egg Day was again a great success and we thank the donors for sending in a twelve months supply. Thanks are also due to the Warrnambool "Standard" Proprietary for their generous publicity.

The following members retire by effluxion of time and are eligible for re-election:—Messrs, H. H. Smith, A. J. Worland, C. Rooney, and J. P. McMeekin.

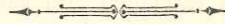
