Committee's Report.

*To the Life Governors and Contributors
Warrnambool Hospital and Benevolent Asylum.*

LADIES AND GENTLEMEN,

The Committee of Management submit for your approval the Annual Report and Statement of Accounts, duly audited, for the year ending June 30th, 1921.

Finance.

We commenced the year with a debit balance of £612/15/1, and it is gratifying to note that notwithstanding the high prices of bread, butter, meat and other commodities used in the Institution the balance now stands at £308/8/8, and the daily average cost per patient is lower than the previous year.

Admissions to Hospital.

In-patients, 536, (268 males, 268 females) received treatment during the year. Out-patients' attendances were 786. The daily average of the hospital patients and benevolents was 44·470, being higher than the previous year although the admissions were 52 less.

Honorary Medical Officers.

To Drs. E. J. Connell, J. H. Henderson, H. I. Holmes, A. H. Dunstan, F. E. Littlewood, J. T. Patrick and J. G. Wilson, special thanks are due for their services to the Institution.

Resident Medical Officer.

Drs. Sutherland and Wallace resigned during the year and Dr. Duncan was appointed on December 20th, 1920, and is still in residence.

Staff.

Matron Anderson and Sisters Saltau and Scott resigned from the Staff during the year, and the vacancies were filled by the appointment of Miss J. Warrender-Davidson as Matron and Miss Paton as Sister. It is interesting to note that the three Sisters mentioned were former trainees of the Institution.

The Committee desire to express their appreciation of the efficient manner in which the members of the Staff carried out their respective duties.

Market Day.

The appeal (so long delayed owing to the war) for funds for remodelling and bringing the Hospital up to date was launched on the 12th March last, when a very successful Market Day was held. The fine spirit of enthusiasm displayed was praiseworthy beyond all measure—city and country alike entering into the undertaking in a whole-hearted manner—with the result that the splendid sum of £5298/5/6, together with other promises amounting to £1515/10/—

which are not yet to hand, was raised. This magnificent response to the appeal was very gratifying indeed to the Committee, and we wish to express our hearty thanks to all those who helped in any way to make the affair such a success.

Encouraged by the support accorded to the appeal your Committee have decided to make the function an annual one, though perhaps not on such an extensive scale.

Expert architectural advice has been obtained and plans are now being prepared for a design which will, we believe, when completed make the Institution worthy of Warrnambool and district.

Vice-Regal Visit.

During the year the Hospital was visited by their Excellencies the Earl and Countess of Stradbroke who were shown through the Institution. Grateful appreciation was expressed for the kindly and sympathetic interest displayed towards the patients by the Vice-Regal visitors.

Leave of Absence.

Mr. M. Saltau who has so ably filled the position of President for many years was granted six months leave of absence on the occasion of his visit to the old land.

Mr. M. L. Carter was appointed a Life Governor, and Messrs. M. Crowe, J. McGann, J. Fleming and C. L. Freeman Annual Governors to the Institution.

Mr. F. C. Osborne resigned as Vice-President, also Mr. C. B. Evans from the Committee, and in them the Institution has lost two very useful Members.

Mr. Rooney was appointed as Vice-President, and Mr. H. J. Worland to fill the vacancy on the Committee.

The following Members retire by effluxion of time and are eligible for re-election, viz.:—Messrs. Jas. Dickson, L. Crawley, W. Swinton and H. J. Worland. It will also be necessary to elect a new Member to fill the vacancy caused through the appointment of the Vice-President.

Obituary.

During the year we suffered a great loss through the death of Mr. C. O'Mahony who was a much esteemed Member of Committee for many years, and was always to the fore when valued assistance was required.

Mr. John Munro, of Framlingham, has also passed away, and he will be much missed as a Country Member.

We again have the pleasure of gratefully acknowledging the splendid service rendered by our Honorary Collector, Mr. H. H. Smith.

The same remarks will of course apply to *The Warrnambool Standard*, for its constant support and assistance.

In conclusion, the Committee wish to thank all who have in any way assisted during the year just closed ; and they feel that the support and assistance of the public may be confidently relied on for the future.
