## COMMITTEE'S REPORT.

---

*To the Life Governors and Contributors*

*Warrnambool Hospital and Benevolent Asylum.*

LADIES AND GENTLEMEN,—

The Committee of Management submit for your approval the Annual Report and Statement of Accounts for the year ending 30th June, 1920.

### FINANCE.

The year closes with an apparent deficit of £612/15/1; but one moiety of the Government Grant amounting to £200 was received late, and will appear in this year's receipts. You will observe that the revenue from ordinary sources is much the same as in previous years, but expenditure (other than new buildings) under various headings, is over £600 in excess of last year. Provisions cost £237 more, fuel and lighting £189, and these two items, with payment to medical staff—£175—account for practically the increase.

### ADMISSIONS TO HOSPITAL.

In-patients, 588 (305 males, 283 females) received treatment during the year. Out-patients attendances were 252. The daily average of hospital patients and benevolents was 42·013, being less than last year. The number who received treatment was greater but the stay in the Institution was shorter. The average cost per bed per annum is much higher.

### HONORARY MEDICAL OFFICERS.

To Drs. E. J. Connell, J. H. Henderson, H. Holmes, A. H. Dunstan, F. E. Littlewood J. T. Patrick, and J. G. Wilson, special thanks are due for their services to the Institution. A resident medical officer has been appointed, and Dr. Sutherland, who was selected, is now in residence.

### STAFF.

The Committee desire to express their appreciation of the efficient manner in which their respective duties have been carried out. Four trainees sat for their finals and all succeeded in passing.

### BEQUESTS.

A bequest of £1000 from the late Geo. Rolfe's estate, has been notified, and this has been handsomely supplemented by a like sum from the Misses Annie and Florence Lake, for the purpose of erecting an operating theatre and sterilising room to be called the "George Rolfe Theatre." A sum of £250 was also bequeathed by the late Thomas Montgomery, of Mortlake. The intended appeal for £10,000 has been allowed to remain in abeyance until the one

for the Memorial to Fallen Soldiers has been closed; but the bequests mentioned above, together with other monies in sight, and several promises, will enable a substantial beginning to be made with some of the most urgent work. Before a start is made, it is the intention of the committee to get the best advice obtainable in regard to modern hospital requirements, and to proceed piece-meal, according to plan and as money is available.

It is very desirable that the public generally should take a keen interest in their hospital, and supply the committee with funds sufficient not only for its proper upkeep, but to make the whole institution worthy of the city and district. Efforts will be made to call into existence the various collecting agencies operating before the war. Sustained effort will accomplish much.

No report would be complete without an acknowledgement of the invaluable services rendered by Mr. H. H. Smith, as honorary collector; also Miss Marjorie Esam and Master Willie Wilson for their weekly gift of eggs throughout the year; the *Warrnambool Standard* and all others who have in any way assisted.
