Committee's Report.

*To the Life Governors and Contributors Warrnambool Hospital
and Benevolent Asylum.*

LADIES AND GENTLEMEN,—

Your Committee have pleasure in submitting for your consideration and approval the Balance Sheet for the year ending June 30th., 1919:—

FINANCE.—You will observe that the total revenue was £4556/2/1 as against £2680/6/6 last year, but this year's figures include a substantial payment from the Whicher Bequest, which has been allotted for the new kitchen now being built. The Government grant shows an increase over last year, but is still much below the years 14-17. Private contributions are much lower, and as these are relied on to supply a large portion of income, steps should be taken to restore the drift. Perhaps some day an equitable taxing basis for hospitals will be found. The income from paying patients is also down, but this is due to one of our wards being utilized for influenza patients, in order to assist the City and Shire Councils.

Expenditure discloses no notable variation. There are increases in some directions and decreases in others. Improvements may reasonably be expected in minor directions.

Admissions to Hospitals.—In-patients, 564 cases (289 males and 275 females) received treatment during the year. Out-patients' attendances, 412. There are five Benevolent inmates. Separate provision should be made, quite apart from the Hospital, for these old folk.

The daily average of Hospital patients and benevolents was 44.12. Although a greater number received Hospital treatment than in other years, their stay in the institution was shorter. The average cost per bed per annum is higher.

Honorary Medical Officers.—Again to Drs. E. J. Connell, J. H. Henderson, H. I. Holmes, A. H. Dunstan, and F. E. Littlewood, special thanks are due for their self-sacrificing services rendered without stint during the year.

Staff.—The influenza epidemic has taxed the members of the staff to the utmost, and the community is under a debt of gratitude to them for the manner in which they rose to the occasion. The general training of the nurses has been interfered with, but an endeavor will be made to find a remedy. The Matron has been untiring in her efforts to meet the extra demands thrown upon the

institution. During the year four trainees went up for their final examination, and all succeeded in passing. The Secretary, Mr. J. Wilson, has carried out his duties with his customary attention.

General.—During the currency of the war no special appeals were made for funds for progressive work at the institution, the Committee being content with funds supplied to meet the ordinary expenditure, but now that the war has happily ended, this policy cannot longer be continued. A large sum will be required to effect renovations and repairs, but, alas, in other respects the Hospital is quite out of date, especially in regard to laundry, steam service for wards, new theatre, an X-ray department, and a general re-modelling is necessary. Warrnambool should be the centre of hospital work for the district it serves, and it should be easily within the powers of the city and district to supply the funds to bring it right up to date.

Returned soldiers and others are brought or sent to Melbourne because of the lack of equipment here. An appeal of £10,000 as a peace thank-offering, has been decided upon and will shortly be launched, when it is hoped a whole-hearted response will result.

In conclusion, we desire to thank Mr. H. H. Smith, whose work as honorary collector is invaluable; also Miss Marjorie Esam and Master W. Wilson, who again have, week by week throughout the year contributed eggs, "The Warrnambool Standard," and the many others not named, but who have assisted from time to time.
