COMMITTEE'S REPORT.

*To the Life Governors and Contributors
Warrnambool Hospital and Benevolent Asylum.*

LADIES AND GENTLEMEN,—

The Committee of Management submit for your approval the Annual Report and Statement of Accounts for the year ending June 30th, 1917.

FINANCE.

MAINTENANCE ACCOUNT—Including Credit Balance of £291 9/2, the revenue from all sources aggregated £3066/12/1, and the total expenditure £2684/14/6. We have to chronicle a further decrease of £70 in the Government Grant, but it is very gratifying to note how well the other sources of revenue have been maintained, and in some cases increased. The hope expressed last year that economies were possible was well founded, as a glance at the Expenditure will show.

A start was made during the year to bring the claims of the Institution more directly under the notice of the various centres included in the Hospital area, and while the response has not been as wide as might have been expected, still it is clearly demonstrated what the possibilities are. An endeavour will be made to arrange that there shall be annual efforts in the above and other townships. Much remains to be done in this direction, but if properly organized, results are certain.

HOSPITAL WORK.

IN-PATIENTS—476 cases (226 males and 250 females) received treatment during the year. Out-patients attendances, 608. The number of Benevolent Inmates remaining 13. The total daily average of Hospital Patients and Benevolents was 46, and the average cost per bed per annum £58/7/3, as against £65/8/6 for the previous year. The higher daily average is due to the unprecedented number of infectious cases treated in the wards set apart for that purpose.

STAFF.

The Committee again desire to express their appreciation of the manner in which the Staff have carried out their duties. On the retirement of Acting-Matron Forbes, Matron Boucher was appointed, and the Hospital was decidedly the better for her coming to it. She resigned to join in a private hospital enterprise, and the Committee wish her every success. Her short stay was marked by great efficiency, There is a reflection of her care, and that of the Superintendent in the figures of the Balance Sheet. Once again all the Trainees who went up passed their examination, qualifying them as Trained Nurses, thus reflecting credit on the Medical Staff and Matron for the care and attention in their training.

Mr. H. H. Smith, Honorary Collector, continues his splendid work, each year being better than the last. We again tender him our warmest thanks. To the *Warrnambool Standard* Pty. for their unstinted support, we also offer our best thanks, and to the many others who have assisted us, but who are not specially named, we desire to express our gratitude.
