PRESIDENT'S REPORT.

To the Life Governors and Contributors

Warrnambool Hospital and Benevolent Asylum.

LADIES AND GENTLEMEN,—

The Committee of Management has again the privilege of presenting to you the Annual Report and Statement of Accounts for the year ending June 30th, 1916.

FINANCE.

Maintenance Account—Including Balance of £567/13/1, the revenue from all sources amounted to £3184/1/4, and the total expenditure £2892/12/2. Government Grant has decreased by £15/8/4, but the other main sources of revenue have increased, which is most gratifying. In common with all other Hospitals, we have had to cope with large increases on the Expenditure side. It is hoped that reductions can be made in several directions during the coming year, and that with the exercise of rigid economy special appeals may again be avoided.

HOSPITAL WORK.

In-patients—461 cases (284 males and 177 females) received treatment during the year. Out-Patients treated, 689. The number of Benevolent Inmates has again fallen from 20 to 17. The total daily average of Hospital Patients and Benevolents was 43.87, and the average cost per head per annum £65/8/6, as against £62/8/6 for the previous year.

HONORARY MEDICAL OFFICERS.

To Drs. E. J. Connell, J. H. Henderson, H. I. Holmes, A. H. Dunstan, F. E. Littlewood; the Honorary Dentists—Mr. M. Hemmons, Mr. W. J. S. Davidson, and Miss Shenfield, thanks are due for the splendid services rendered during the year.

The Committee desire to express appreciation of the manner in which the Staff have carried out their duties. Although granted indefinite leave, Matron Reeves, who is still at the front, felt that in the best interests of the Hospital, she should resign, and acted accordingly. Acting Matron Male, also resigned after filling the position capably for twelve months. All the Trainees who went up passed their examination, qualifying them as trained Nurses, thus reflecting credit on the Medical Staff and Acting Matron for the care and attention in their training. Sister Forbes is at present Acting Matron. Mr. Butler resigned early in the year to take up a more lucrative position, and Mr. J. Wilson was appointed to the vacant position and is energetically performing the duties of the

RETIRING OFFICE-BEARERS.

Messrs. S. G. Russell, H. H. Smith, F. C. Osborne, C. B. Evans and J. E. Bennett retire from the Committee. In addition, one Member in place of Dr. Holmes is required. Mr. T. W. Farmer and Mr. T. W. Crothers retire by rotation from the Country Committee. Medical Officers—Drs. E. J. Connell, J. H. Henderson, H. I. Holmes, A. H. Dunstan, and F. E. Littlewood. All the above retire through effluxion of time, and are eligible for re-election.

Dr. Holmes resigned during the year, and his resignation was received with regret.

OBITUARY.

The Committee desire to place on record its deep regret at the death of Ex-President E. H. Price, with an expression of genuine appreciation of the valued assistance he gave in the interests of the Institution.

CONCLUSION.

It is pleasing to note, that notwithstanding the many Patriotic Appeals on account of the War, the public are not altogether forgetful of their principal local charity, and the Committee desire to thank the Contributors for their support. At the same time, there are many in the District who can well afford to become Annual Subscribers of £1, and thus secure the right to share in the control of the Institution. A donation of £20 entitles the donor to a Life Governorship.

The services rendered by Miss May Esam and Master Willie Wilson in giving every week, without fail, a donation of Eggs, has given lively satisfaction.

Mr. H. H. Smith, Honorary Collector, has again done splendid work—his efforts this year bringing in over £100. To him our special thanks are due. To the *Warrnambool Standard Pty.* for their support, we also give our best thanks, and to the others who have assisted us, but who are not specially named, we desire to express our gratitude.
