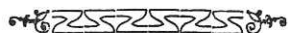

Turning to expenditure, the cost of provisions is £56 in advance of previous year, but, this is accountable for, in that, the daily average has increased.

Under Surgery and Dispensary there is a decrease of £80. A fair comparison cannot be drawn owing to the Dispensary being stocked in 1912.

In the Domestic Account, Renewal of Furniture shows £142. This was principally caused by the purchase of new beds and mattresses, the old ones in both Wards being replaced by those of latest pattern. The money for this object was provided by the Hospital Ball Committee, Western District Football Association, South Warrnambool Football Club, Citizens' Band, Town Band, Sons of Temperance, and Mrs. Davis.

Messrs. Smith, Russell and Evans retire by rotation, and Mr. Beeching by ballot, from the Town Committee ; all are eligible for re-election.

Messrs. Farmer and Anderson retire from the Country Committee and they also are eligible for re-election, there are also two other seats on this Committee to fill.

The Life Governors appointed during the year were Mesdames Jos. Smith, Jas. Lee and Chas. Clothier, and Messrs. F. O'Brien, John Fisher, senr., J. J. Grogan and A. Skilbeck.

Dr. Campbell who was Resident Medical Officer resigned his position in January last and for three months the work was carried out by all the Honorary Staff.

Dr. Griffith is now successfully carrying out the duties.

The proposed alteration of the Bye-laws controlling the admission of patients and the election of Life Governors is recommended for adoption at the Special Meeting to be called for the purpose.

Once again, the Committee desire to place on record their appreciation of the invaluable services rendered to the Institution by the Honorary Medical Staff.

The Report would not be complete without an acknowledgement of the continued enthusiasm displayed by the ladies in the raising of funds for the Institution, also to the Koroit Charity Carnival Committee, to the " Warrnambool Standard " and to all those who have rendered assistance from time to time.

In conclusion, the Committee express their appreciation of the work of the Resident Medical Officer, Secretary, Matron, and all the Officers and Staff of the Institution.

## President's Report.

July 16th, 1913.

*To the Life Governors and Contributors,  
Warrnambool Hospital and Benevolent Asylum.*

Ladies and Gentlemen,

Your Committee have pleasure in presenting for your consideration and adoption, the various Balance Sheets and Reports for the twelve months ending 30th June, 1913.

The number of cases treated in the Hospital were 404, being an increase of 36 over the previous year, with a daily average of 28 as against 26 during 1912.

In the Benevolent Asylum the cases treated were 39, being one less than last year, with a daily average of 24 as against 25 in 1912.

The number of attendances of Out Patients were 980, a decrease of 456

During the last three months of the financial year, a very busy time was experienced in the Infectious Wards owing to the prevalence of Infectious Diseases.

On the Financial side, the Maintenance Account at the commencement of the Year showed an overdraft of £226/1/2. The year ended with a credit balance of £216/6/5 due to the five instalments of the Government Grant being received instead of the usual four. Independent of this amount a credit balance of £9/2/10 would have been shown on the year's work which, we trust, you will consider satisfactory.

You will observe the total receipts amount to £2995/12/9, and the total expenditure £2565/4/6. The average cost per head per annum being £48/13/5 as against £50/11/6 last year.

After deducting contributions from Employees of Firms and donations from Charitable Funds, etc., Private Contributions show a decrease of about £100 but, it is gratifying to note an increase of £122 in the Patients' Contribution Account.

The Committee are pleased to note that two large Employers have arranged with their Employees to contribute a penny per week, the result being £27 and £10 respectively. This system is commended to the consideration of other Employers.

From proceeds of Entertainments there is an increase of £173, resulting largely from the sum of £267/3 raised by the Hospital Ball Committee—a splendid effort. Consideration is to be given to a scheme for systematic collecting and the co-operation of the ladies is necessary for a successful issue.
