President's Report.

July 27th, 1911.

*To the Life Governors and Contributors.
Warrnambool Hospital and Benevolent Asylum.*

Ladies and Gentlemen,

Your Committee have pleasure in submitting for your consideration and adoption the various Balance Sheets and Statements for the twelve months ended 30th June 1911. They include the Maintenance Fund, Building Fund, Thomson Fund Capital Account and Report of the Medical Officer.

From a medical point of view the staff have been somewhat busier than last year, the Hospital cases treated being 35 patients more, while the Asylum showed an increase of 5 patients, and the attendances of out-patients were 176 greater than the previous year; the daily averages for the Hospital are about 1 more than last year, while the Asylum shows about 2 less.

Turning to the financial side, the Maintenance Account as presented shows that this fund was, at the beginning of the year, in debt to the Bank to the extent of £36 7s., while at the end of the year this had increased to £366 os. 8d. This, without any explanation, would be a very serious state of affairs; but when it is pointed out than an amount of about £405, which should have come to hand (viz., from Government Grant £250, Town Council £95, Band £10, Mortlake Shire £30, Koroit Borough £20) before the year closed, did not come in till after the 30th June, and therefore could not be included in these Statements, it makes matters look somewhat better. Had these amounts come to hand in time this fund would have shown a better position than last year by about £75.

In comparing the different items with the previous 12 months: The Government Grant and the Municipal Grant, owing to the circumstance stated above, of course show a falling off, but it will be noted with gratification that the Private Subscriptions show an increase of £117, Proceeds of Entertainments £135 increase, Hospital Saturday and Sunday Collections are better by £9, and the In-Patients Contributions are greater by £160.

On the other side, the increase of expenditure is mainly—Provisions £40, Surgery and Dispensary £58, Domestic £68 (this includes a large quantity of wood and coal, which is still on hand for the benefit of the following half-year), Salaries and Wages £90 (this includes the additional salary given to the House Steward as Secretary). Taken altogether the Expenditure is £198 more than the previous twelve months. The Outdoor Relief this year was £23 10s., as against £41 19s. for last year.

During the year we had to accept the resignations of two very old and respected members of the Committee in Messrs. Ardlie and Ward, who each had given many years of valuable services to the Institution. Mr. T. Nayler also resigned his position through leaving the district. These three vacancies you are required to fill at this meeting. Messrs. Parrington, Robinson and Saltau retire by rotation from the Town Committee, but are eligible and are nominated for re-election. The Country Members who retire are Messrs. Burleigh, Horne, Halley Jenkins and O'Keefe, who also are again nominated, with the exception of Mr. Burleigh, whose nomination was received a day late.

Mr. W. F. Gall, who was Acting-Secretary at the last Annual Meeting, was later on appointed to the position of Secretary, House Steward and Dispenser, but he resigned at the 30th June last, and his successor, Mr. J. G. Butler, took up the duties from the 1st July. The Committee desire to thank Mr. A. A. Briggs, our former Secretary, for assisting the new officer to prepare the Balance Sheets and Statements.

Many different schemes for the establishment of a Dispensary and Children's Ward were brought forward during the year, and it was not until the close of it that a design was decided on, and the work is now in progress and should be completed in a few weeks time. In this matter it is pleasing to note that the Mayor and Mrs. Saltau have kindly donated £25 for the purpose of furnishing the Children's Ward, as a Coronation gift.

The Hospital Ball last year resulted in the substantial sum of about £120 being added to the funds of the Institution. The annual Koroit Carnival was another successful effort in the cause of charity.

The Life Governors appointed during the year were Miss Doherty, and Messrs. W. Ardlie, John Ward, C. Uebergang, T. Paton and Sol. Green.

The septic tank caused some trouble during the early summer, but has been doing better lately; but of course it has been colder weather, when any nuisance may not be so noticeable.

Dr. Adey, who was the Resident Medical Officer at the beginning of the year, had to leave us, and Dr. Horgan filled the breach and completed the 12 months, and every one concerned was sorry when his time for retiring arrived. Dr. Spring was the Honor-man appointed to the Warrnambool Hospital, but he had hardly started his duties when he got an appointment at a City Hospital, leaving the position open to Dr. Atkinson, who is now successfully carrying out the duties.

The mode of collecting subscriptions for the Institution is a matter which the new Committee will have to go into. We are now without a Collector, and some scheme will have to be taken in hand. It has been suggested that an endeavour should be made to have a huge annual Carnival in aid of charity, as is done in several other country centres.

The Government provided a "good substantial dinner" for the inmates and benevolents on Coronation Day, and it was a successful affair and was much appreciated.

The Grounds Committee have apportioned a part of the grounds for a Tennis Court for the nursing staff, and it is expected that three or four working-bees among some of those who have received the benefits of the Hospital, would provide a Court which would be of much benefit and pleasure to the staff.

The Committee tender thanks to all who have assisted them in the cause of charity, and to the "Standard" for their efforts in keeping up the weekly "flower day," which so materially helps to brighten up the wards and cheer up those in affliction and suffering.

The Honorary Medical Staff, as usual, have been unremitting in their attention at the Hospital, and help materially to the effective working of the Institution.

The Committee express their appreciation of the work of the Resident Medical Officer, the Matron, the Secretary, and all officers and staff of the Institution. The Matron, through the death of a near relative, is just now away on leave, and Sister Harsant is carrying out the duties as Acting Matron.
