## COMMITTEE'S REPORT

#### TO THE LIFE GOVERNORS AND CONTRIBUTORRS.

Ladies and Gentlemen,—

Your Committee has pleasure in submitting for your approval its Eighty-fourth Annual Report for the year ending 30th June, 1938.

The Balance Sheet disclosed that the year has been a successful one financially, the receipts totalling £10,069 and expenditure £9,397, leaving a surplus of £690. This result was due to several factors, mainly the continued hearty support of Country Quota Committees, which are now functioning 100 per cent. the first time for a number of years, and payments by patients produced a good percentage of income and assisted in bringing about the happy result. The bed cost, although increased to £119/16/4, is still satisfactory and compares very favorably with other similar Institutions. Your Committee anticipates continued support from the Country districts, so that the best Hospital benefits can be rendered to its patients. With the continued spirit of helpfulness by city and district residents the Hospital can meet its obligations to provide the best Hospital benefits to its inmates.

#### DEVELOPMENT.

It was reported last year that the development of the Institution would be commenced at an early date. A commencement was made on 23rd September last, in the work of developing the new unit to provide Private, Intermediate and Midwifery sections. Mr. E. S. Harris is the builder and the Architectural work in the hands of the office of Mr. Leighton Irwin. It is expected that the Building will be opened in November, when the Public will have the opportunity of inspecting what is considered to be a very complete and modern section of a Community Hospital. The building has been named the "Marcus Saltau House" and the Foundation Stone will be laid by the President on Saturday, 23rd July, 1938. Your Committee feels that the building when completed will not only be a great and modern advantage to the residents of the Hospital area, but also be one that each and every resident will be proud of. An appeal for £5,000, to assist in purchasing the furnishings and equipment, will be launched at an early date.

#### PATIENTS.

July 1st, 1937—June 30th, 1938.

The number of patients treated was 1754, comprising 836 males and 918 females, the daily average being 77.14, a slight increase on the previous year, when the average was 75.22. The number of outpatients treated was 610, representing 1755 visits. In the Saltau Memorial Maternity Ward 211 babies were born as against 239 last year. The Infectious cases treated number 24. This district was fortunate when only a few cases of Infantile Paralysis were recorded during the very serious epidemic.

#### HONORARY MEDICAL STAFF.

The special thanks of the Committee is tendered to Doctors J. H. Henderson, H. I. Holmes, F. E. Littlewood, J. F. Patrick, A. E. Brauer, Irving Buzzard, C. C. MacKnight and E. G. Bannon for their valuable services. Another development during the year was the appointment to the permanent staff of Dr. J. F. Patrick as Radiologist. This Department is already giving good service to the Base Hospital area. The thanks of the Committee is also tendered to the Dental Honoraries, Messrs. W. J. S. Davidson and Dr. J. C. V. Kirkham. The Specialization of the Honorary Medical Staff has been developed and as time goes on it is hoped for further progress, thus adding to the existing prestige of your Base Hospital.

#### NURSING STAFF.

The efficiency of the Nursing Staff is being maintained at a high standard and the year has been a busy one. It is pleasing to report that nurses E. Monkivitch, M. Brown, A. Young, A. Brown, E. Paton, W. Oram and N. Rodgers were successful in passing their R.V.T.N.A. examination. Nurses F. Podger, M. Curran, E. Treloar and H. Bayley have also passed their Midwifery Examinations, having qualified at this Hospital.

#### RETIRING OFFICERS.

The following members retire and are eligible for re-election : Crs. F. Williamson, W. J. Ross, R. M. Burnie and Messrs. H. Lord, J. Dickson, F. T. Redford, W. Henderson and R. Glasgow.

#### RED CROSS AUXILIARIES.

The Committee extends hearty and appreciative thanks to the members of the various Red Cross Hospital Auxiliaries for valuable and helpful interest and Contributions which are so willingly given to the Hospital on behalf of the sick and suffering. The work of the Ladies from the City Auxiliary who attend at the Hospital weekly for sewing is also greatly appreciated. The Hospital is indeed fortunate in being served so faithfully by such a splendid organization which does so much to assist the unfortunate sick and suffering of our district.

#### EGG APPEAL.

The Annual Egg Appeal again realized approximately 2,000 dozen. This will suffice for Hospital needs until next Egg Day, and to all those who assisted and contributed, thanks are accorded.

#### WOOD APPEAL.

The residents of Nullawarre again organized a wood appeal, and as a result some 152 tons of wood was stacked in the Hospital yard. To Cr. R. M. Burnie and his team of workers sincere thanks and appreciation are accorded.

#### EMPLOYEES' CONTRIBUTIONS.

This form of revenue has practically ceased and the Hospital Benefits Association has taken its place. This form of Insurance shculd prove of great value to the Hospital and your Committee hopes that Employers and Employees will more and more give consideration to this organization. To those who have assisted prior to the change over thanks are accorded.

#### COUNTRY QUOTAS.

It is indeed pleasing to report that in the 21 districts where the Quota has been initiated Committees are active and working hard in the interest of the Institution. Now that the 100 per cent. co-operation has been reached your Committee is hopeful that the good work will be carried on. Thanks and appreciation is extended to all who assisted in their respective districts.

#### BUILDING FUND.

During the year with the development of the new unit, the building account has been used freely. The account is at present £6017/18/7 in credit, but a lot of work has yet to be done.
