COMMITTEE'S REPORT

TO THE LIFE GOVERNORS, ANNUAL GOVERNORS, AND
CONTRIBUTORS.

Ladies and Gentlemen,—

Your Committee has pleasure in submitting for your approval its Eighty-Third Annual Report.

FINANCE.

The year just completed has been a very successful one financially. The main factors contributing to the result are increased payments of patients, and very much appreciated renewed co-operation from the Country Quota Committees. The receipts totalled £10,268 1/8, and expenditure £8,349 0/6. The credit balance in the Maintenance Account at the end of the year is £826 7/11. During the year the Reserve Account was built up to a credit of £1348 8/8. The bed cost of £108 2/9 is still low, and compares very favorably with other similar institutions. Your Committee looks for a continuance of the hearty support of the city and country districts, so that full Hospital benefits can be rendered to its patients.

DEVELOPMENT.

The building scheme that has already been reported on has been a problem for your Committee during the year. In order to obtain the very best results much time and labor has been spent on this question and now it is expected that at a very early date the scheme will be commenced. It will provide many advantages and particularly develop the Private, Intermediate and Midwifery sections as well as services and the like. It must be mentioned here that an appeal will be made to the Public of Warrnambool, at an early date, to assist in the furnishing of the New Block, and your Committee is hopeful of a very generous response.

PATIENTS.

July 1st, 1936—June 30th, 1937.

The number of patients treated was 1762, comprising 807 males, 925 females, the daily average being 75.22. The number of Out-Patients treated was 560, representing 2,500 visits. In the Saltau Memorial Maternity Ward 239 babies were born, as against 221 last year. The Infectious cases numbered 30.

HONORARY MEDICAL STAFF.

The special thanks of the Committee is tendered to Doctors J. H. Henderson, H. I. Holmes, F. E. Littlewood, J. F. Patrick, A. E. Brauer, Irving Buzzard, C. C. Macknight and E. G. Bannon for their valuable services, and also Dental Honorary Messrs. W. J. S. Davidson and Dr. J. C. V. Kirkham. The question of specialization has been

discussed very fully and a commencement in this direction will be inaugurated shortly. As time goes on it is hoped for further progress, thus adding to the existing prestige of your base hospital.

NURSING STAFF.

The efficiency of the Nursing Staff is being maintained at a high standard and the year has been a very busy one. It is pleasing to report that Nurses M. Jenkin, M. Fotheringham, F. Zeunert, H. Myles, M. Wilton, S. Jenkin, A. McNair and D. Bernhardt were successful in passing their R.V.T.N.A. examination. Nurses M. Wright, T. Vollprecht, P. Charles, L. McKellar, L. Paton, P. Greenwood, M. Cheshire and B. Brown have also passed their Midwifery Examinations, having qualified at this Hospital.

RETIRING OFFICERS.

Five city members, viz.—Messrs. A. J. Moloney, R. V. Philpott, H. H. Smith, J. McD. Taylor and H. J. Worland retire and are eligible for re-election. Messrs. R. H. Corrie, J. A. Rollo, C. J. Horn and G. S. Officer, Country Members, retire and are eligible for re-election. One vacancy exists on the Country Committee, caused by the death of the late W. W. Johnstone.

RED CROSS AUXILIARIES.

The Committee extend hearty and appreciative thanks to the members of the various Red Cross Hospital Auxiliaries for valuable and helpful interest and contributions which are so willingly given to the Hospital on behalf of the sick and suffering. The work of the ladies from the City Auxiliary, who attend at the Hospital weekly for sewing, is also greatly appreciated. The Jam Appeal this year was again highly successful, and while insufficient for the year's supply, will go a long way towards meeting the demand. All those who helped or contributed are cordially thanked. The Institution is indeed fortunate to be served so faithfully by such a splendid organization.

EGG APPEAL.

The Annual Egg Appeal realized 2000 dozen eggs. This will suffice the Hospital needs until next Egg Day, and to all those who assisted and contributed, thanks are accorded.

WOOD APPEAL.

The residents of Nullawarre organized a Wood Day, and as a result over 200 tons of wood was stacked in the Hospital Yard. To Cr. R. M. Burnie and his team of workers, sincere thanks and appreciation are accorded.

EMPLOYEES' CONTRIBUTIONS.

To the Employees who contributed to the Hospital during the year, thanks are expressed. Their practical assistance is very much appreciated. The following assisted in this way : Nestles, Woollen Mill, Town Hall (Office and Day Labor Staffs), Railways, Technical

School, Swintons Pty. Ltd., Hammond and Sons, Warrnambool Standard, J. G. Beardsley and Co., Saltau and Sons. Pty. Ltd., Gas Works, and A.M.P. Society.

COUNTRY QUOTAS.

The Country Quota Committees have done excellent work during the year, and played their part well in the financing of the Hospital. Several districts that have not been working in recent years are now hard at work and figures from practically every district show an increase on the previous year. It is sincerely hoped that during the ensuing year 100 per cent. co-operation from the districts will be obtained. Thanks and appreciation is extended to all who assisted in their respective districts.

BUILDING FUND.

During the year under review no important works were undertaken, and the account, which had a Debit Balance brought forward from last year of £397/10/9, is now £3000 in credit. To bring this about, £397/10/9 was transferred from Reserve Account, and the Government Grant towards public services in the new scheme, amounted to £3000.

DONATIONS AND BEQUESTS.

Your Committee gratefully acknowledge a donation of £377/5/- from Lord Nuffield, who made a visit to Australia during the year. In recognition of this gift the generous donor was elected a Life Governor of the Institution. The following bequests were received during the year :—
