Committee's Report.

TO THE LIFE GOVERNORS, ANNUAL GOVERNORS, AND CONTRIBUTORS.

Ladies and Gentlemen.—

Your Committee has pleasure in submitting for your approval its Eighty-Second Annual Report.

FINANCE.

During the year under review the sum of £8781/7/10 was expended by your Committee in maintaining a Hospital service commenced 82 years ago. The expenditure totalled £8917/11/8, thus leaving an overdraft at the end of the year of £108/8/3, which is considered a satisfactory state of affairs. To bring this about £472/19/7 was transferred from Reserve Account. The bed cost of £105/8/3 compares very favorably with other Institutions and can be regarded as satisfactory. Your Committee hopes for the continued liberal support of both city and country residents.

DEVELOPMENT.

Your Committee reports with pleasure, that at an early date, the development to full Community standard, will be commenced and the work (costing approximately £34,000) when completed, will enable the Institution to provide a service for all sections of the public, on modern, up to date lines, and in keeping with the importance of the area to be served.

PATIENTS.

The number of patients treated for the year under review was 1619, comprising 783 males and 836 females, the daily average being 79.1. The number of out-patients treated was 1466, representing 3454 visits. In the "Saltau" Memorial Maternity Ward 221 babies were born. The Infectious patients numbered 32.

HONORARY MEDICAL STAFF.

The thanks of the Committee is tendered to Drs. J. H. Henderson, H. I. Holmes, F. E. Littlewood, J. F. Patrick, A. E. Brauer, I. Buzzard, C. C. Macknight, E. G. Bannon, and M. M. Lyons for their valuable services, and also to the Dental Honoraries, Messrs. W. J. S. Davidson and Dr. J. C. V. Kirkham.

The Honorary Staff has done excellent work for the Institution and incidentally the city and districts of Warrnambool.

NURSING STAFF.

During the year Miss J. M. Little was appointed to the position of Matron to fill the vacancy caused by the resignation of Matron Griffiths. The efficiency of the Nursing Staff is still maintained at a very high standard. During the year Nurses, A. McWilliam, M. Duncan, L. Paton, D. Neave and T. Luker were successful in passing their R. V. T. N. A. examinations. Nurses K. Davis, M. Evans, G. Jenkin, M. McGregor, and M. Rooney have also passed their Midwifery examinations having qualified at this hospital. The results in both General and Midwifery Training continue to be 100 per cent successes.

During the year the resignation of Mr. T. C. Robinson, who had filled the position of Secretary and Superintendent for the past nine years, was received with regret and appreciation of his services over that period is here recorded. Mr. J. L. Plummer, of Daylesford, was appointed to fill the vacancy.

RETIRING OFFICERS.

Five city members, viz:—Messrs J. Dickson, J. D. Walter, Dr. Henderson, Cr. J. Jackman and E. A. Wright retire and are eligible for re-election. Messrs D. O'Keefe and Carlos Gordon, country members retire and are eligible for re-election.

RED CROSS AUXILIARIES.

The sincere thanks and appreciation of your Committee is extended to various Hospital Auxiliaries. The work that they do in connection with the Hospital is of great value and it is felt that their efforts so freely given, are impossible to record in £. S. D. The supply of linen, crockery, cutlery, glassware, hot water bags etc., as well as the sewing done, is greatly appreciated by the Committee. The low bed cost is in some measure due to the Hospital Auxiliaries in city and districts. The Annual Egg Appeal, Jam Appeal etc., were above average and thanks are tendered to each and every person who assisted.

EMPLOYEES' CONTRIBUTIONS.

To the employees who contributed to the Hospital during the year, thanks are expressed. Their practical assistance is very acceptable. COUNTRY QUOTAS.

The Country Quota Committees continue their good work in their respective districts, and a perusal of the financial statements will show to what extent they assisted the Committee. Thanks and appreciation are extended to all who assisted in their respective areas.

BUILDING FUND.

During the year under review some monies have been expended on Building work such as the Pathological Laboratory and the Domestic Quarters. The Debit Balance of the Building Account at the close of the year is £397/10/9.

DONATIONS AND BEQUESTS.

Numerous special donations have been received during the year, and to these donors we also extend our thanks and appreciation. It is hoped that more of our people will think of their Hospital when making their Will.

GENERAL.

The thanks and appreciation of the Committee is tendered to the "Warrnambool Standard" Pty. Ltd. for their very generous and acceptable publicity in the interest of the Hospital. It must be mentioned here, that in a report such as this, it would not be possible to thank each and every person who directly or indirectly assisted during the year, but your Committee requests that all who assisted in any way during the year, accept their thanks and appreciation.
