COMMITTEE'S REPORT.

TO THE LIFE GOVERNORS, ANNUAL GOVERNORS, AND CONTRIBUTORs.

Ladies and Gentlemen,—

Your Committee have pleasure in submitting for your approval their Eighty First Annual Report.

FINANCE.

With the ever widening activities of a Base Hospital and the increased demands upon its services finance always calls for serious consideration. The Gross Expenditure for the year under review was £8,331, or about £160 per week. The system of budgeting has been continued with very satisfactory results. It is gratifying to note that there has been an increase in the amount contributed by In-Patients, Out-Patients and for X-Ray treatments, and also in the voluntary contributions. With the support which the public of Warrnambool and District are always willing to give it has been possible to close the year with the comparatively small debit balance of £244. The bed cost is still at a very satisfactory low figure and compares more than favorably with other Base Hospitals. This is re-assuring as it goes to show that the administration is based on most economical lines consistent with efficiency and the maintenance of essential services. Your Committee hopes for the continued and liberal support of both town and country residents.

CONTRIBUTORY SCHEME.

Your Committee has given very careful consideration to this matter and consider that, until such time as some compulsory system of contribution is introduced by the Government, a contributory Hospital benefit scheme such as is already working satisfactorily in many parts of the State should be adopted in Warrnambool. It is expected that such a scheme will be inaugurated in the near future.

DEVELOPMENT.

With the advance in modern Hospital development your Committee, realising its responsibility to the community, is hopeful of undertaking some much needed extensions and improvements in order that the Institution may be brought up to full Community standard, involving an estimated expenditure of £25,000. A start has been made in the erection of a modern block of quarters for the domestic staff.

PATIENTS.

July 1st., 1934, to June 30th., 1935.

The number of patients treated was 1546 comprising 710 males and 836 females, the daily average being 78.72. The number of Out-patients treated was 1377. In the "Saltau" Memorial Maternity Ward 205 babies were born. The Infectious Wards have not been so busy and were closed for some months. The total number of patients treated was 25.

HONORARY MEDICAL STAFF.

The special thanks of the Committee are again tendered to Drs. J. H. Henderson, H. I. Holmes, F. E. Littlewood, J. F. Patrick, A. E. Brauer, I. Buzzard, C. C. Macknight, E. Bannon and M. M. Lyons for their valuable services, and also to the Dental Honorary, Messrs. W. J. S. Davidson and C. Kirkham. While the desired specialization has not yet been accomplished, a step forward has been made by the appointment of Dr. E. G. Bannon as Hon. Pathologist. The Pathological Laboratory is being equipped at considerable cost and will be capable of dealing with work not only from this Hospital, but also for the surrounding districts. This added Service will mean efficiency in the treatment of patients.

RESIDENT MEDICAL OFFICER.

The difficulty of obtaining the services of an R.M.O. is still acute as with other Hospitals and the Hospital was without an R.M.O. for part of the year. Dr. A. S. Frater resigned his position and Dr. F. Guy Tuddenham was appointed in his stead.

NURSING STAFF.

The Hospital has a very efficient staff, Matron, Sisters and Nurses rendering splendid service. After being nearly eight years in charge, Matron Griffiths has resigned to take up the position of Matron at the Ballarat Base Hospital. With great regret the Committee accepted her resignation and desire to place on record their appreciation of her valuable all round services to the Institution.

During the year Nurses O. McKenzie, P. Charles, B. Coleman, G. Chandy, U. Armstrong, N. Kirby, J. Riddle, G. Jenkin, A. Henderson and J. Taylor were successful in passing their R.V.T.N.A. examinations. Nurses J. Hudson, A. Dixon, L. Langdon, A. Wilton and M. Hare have also passed their Midwifery examinations having qualified at this Hospital. The results in both General and Midwifery Training continue to be 100% successes.

RETIRING OFFICERS.

Three City members of Committee, viz:—Messrs. F. T. Redford, M. T. Whiting and Wm. Robinson retire and are eligible for re-election. The position of Hon. Treasurer is vacant consequent upon the death of Mr. J. P. McMeekin. Messrs. R. M. Burnie, W. J. Ross, Wm. Henderson and R. Glasgow, Country Members, retire and are eligible for re-election. There is also a vacancy for a member in place of Mr. Wm. Lindsay (decd.) and one other vacancy for a country member.

RED CROSS AUXILIARIES.

Your Committee desires to express to the members of the various Hospital Auxiliaries their thanks for their excellent service and their valuable donations both so willingly given. The City Auxiliary has done splendidly this year in the matter of linen and sewing. Allansford has again contributed for Cutlery while Dennington has supplied Crockery etc. Grasmere has provided hot water bags, glassware, etc. These branches as well as others have also contributed extras such as groceries, biscuits, jellies, preserved fruits, etc. The Hospital benefited considerably from the Annual Jam Day conducted by the City Auxiliary, and also from the Allansford Jam Appeal. This contribution is very greatly appreciated and means a considerable saving to the Hospital.

The Annual Egg Appeal was held as usual with a splendid response. Those loyal workers who so consistently sponsor this appeal again gave their services.

To all contributors either to Jam Day, Egg Day or to Hospital Auxiliary funds the Committee express their grateful thanks for the valuable help given.

EMPLOYEES' CONTRIBUTIONS.

In spite of adverse circumstances a number of employees continue their regular contributions and for this practical help the Committee is very grateful. As honorary Treasurer he took a keen personal interest in the finances of the Institution and the sound position is in no small measure due to his oversight. We will miss his cheery optimism. The Committee express their deepest sympathy with the bereaved families.
