Committee's Report

TO THE LIFE GOVERNORS, ANNUAL GOVERNORS, AND CONTRIBUTORS,

Ladies and Gentlemen,—

Your Committee have pleasure in submitting for your approval their Eightieth Annual Report.

FINANCE AND GENERAL.

The financial position of the Hospital, as at the 30th June, presents a more hopeful outlook than twelve months ago, the then debit balance having been converted into a credit. The expenditure on some items has been exceptionally heavy, owing, chiefly, to linen replacements and to general repairs. A large outlay was occasioned by sewerage connections. The introduction of the budgeting system has produced good results, but unforeseen expenditure has, in some cases, caused estimates to be exceeded. Coupled with the closest scrutiny of accounts, care is taken to see that efficiency is not impaired. Consideration is being given to proposed large extensions, so that the Institution may function as a first class Base Hospital on complete community lines. The cost per bed is somewhat higher than last year, but is still very satisfactory. Contributing schemes are being investigated, and it is hoped to introduce one which will prove of mutual benefit to subscribers and the Hospital. Your Committee looks for a continuance of the hearty support of the town and country districts, so that its administration can be properly carried on.

PATIENTS.

During the year 679 males and 909 females were treated, making a total of 1588. The Infectious Diseases Hospital has been open all the year, the total admissions being 89. The daily average increased to 85.56. The Maternity Ward continues its popularity, and during the year 195 babies were born therein. The mortality rate was very low, being 2.57%.

HONORARY MEDICAL STAFF.

The special thanks of the Committee are again tendered to Drs. J. H. Henderson, H. I. Holmes, F. E. Littlewood, J. F. Patrick, A. E. Brauer, I. Buzzard, C. C. MacKnight, E. Bannon, and M. M. Lyons, for their valuable services; and also to the Dental Honorary, Messrs. W. J. S. Davidson and C. Kirkham. Consideration is being given by the Hon. Medical Staff to a scheme of specialisation, and it is hoped that a definite move will be made in this direction.

RESIDENT MEDICAL OFFICER.

In common with other Country Hospitals, there is still some difficulty in obtaining the services of an R.M.O. Dr. A. S. Frater was appointed during the year, and still holds the position.

NURSING STAFF.

The Hospital is very efficiently staffed, Matron, Sisters and Nurses all combining to render services of their best.

During the years Nurses D. M. Hickey, B. Wall, M. G. Forsythe, I. E. Fahey, M. M. Evans, L. M. Taylor, E. A. Wilton, A. Dixon, L. E. Langdon, C. J. Hudson, W. M. Hare, and K. E. Davis were successful in passing their R.V.T.N.A. examination.

Nurses F. McDonald, J. L. Watt, M. P. McPhee, N. M. Pilley, M. V. Ratcliffe, L. I. McLaren, and M. E. Howard have passed their Midwifery examination, having qualified at this Hospital.

RETIRING OFFICERS.

Messrs. H. H. Smith, Wm. Robinson, A. J. Moloney and J. McD. Taylor, City members of Committee, retire by effluxion of time and are eligible for re-election. There are also three vacancies to be filled consequent upon the death of Mr. J. Mainland and the resignation of Messrs. E. H. Shaw and A. D. Randall. Messrs. J. Jackman, R. V. Philpott, and H. J. Worland, who were elected to fill the vacancies, are eligible for re-election. Messrs. Wm. Lindsay and R. H. Corrie, Country members, also retire, and are eligible for re-election. There is also one vacancy for a Country member.

RED CROSS AUXILIARY.

The members of the City Auxiliary, Allansford, Dennington, Wangoom, Grasmere and Nullawarre, have again rendered most valuable services to the Hospital by their contributions in cash and kind, and by personal service. The idea of specializing by the various Auxiliaries continues. The City is supplying part of the linen, which in every hospital is a costly item. Allansford specializes in cutlery, and Dennington in crockery. These branches, also, as well as other country Auxiliaries, contribute extras such as biscuits, groceries, jellies, preserved fruits, etc. The annual Jam Day was held in the City as usual. The Allansford branch made a separate local effort. The number of containers this year was somewhat less than usual, and while not sufficient to meet the needs of the Hospital, the contribution was a most valuable help.

The annual Egg Appeal was held earlier than usual, and in consequence of this the total number received was slightly less, but was sufficient for the greater part of the year's requirements. Again the kind friends who so consistently look after the details of the appeal gave their services.

To all contributors, either to Jam Day, Egg Day or to the Hospital Auxiliary Funds, the Committee express their grateful thanks for the valuable help given.

EMPLOYEES' CONTRIBUTIONS.

These continue to prove a most valuable addition to the revenue, but naturally have decreased on account of reduced wages and unemployment relief tax. The grateful thanks of the Committee are given to those who show in such a practical way their interest in the sick.

Fletcher Jones State Electricity Commission, and several Bank Staffs.

ENTERTAINMENTS.

Entertainments again provided a considerable sum during the year—viz., £400/14/4. The "Obstinate Artist" "Sun-Pictorial" Fund provided £275/15/1; Annual Hospital Ball, £37; Civic Pictures, £40; Warrnambool Racing Club Meeting, £6/2/10; Warrnambool Progress Association, £24/9/-; Warrnambool Fire Brigade, £17/7/5. To all those who organised these efforts or otherwise contributed to their success the Committee tender their best thanks.

COUNTRY QUOTAS.

The organised effort in the country districts continues to provide a considerable amount of revenue. For various reasons several districts were unable to contribute their usual quota this year, but in these cases a special appeal will be made during the spring.
