Committee's Report.

**TO THE LIFE GOVERNORS, ANNUAL GOVERNORS
AND CONTRIBUTORS.**

LADIES AND GENTLEMEN,—

Your Committee have pleasure in submitting for your approval their Seventy-ninth Annual Report.

FINANCE.

The financial outlook at the beginning of the year did not engender optimistic feelings, opening as it did with an adverse balance of approximately £1000. Possible economies were investigated, and the system of budgeting expenditure was introduced, with the result that a very effective and continuous check was imposed on all outgoings. The actual expenditure was less than the allocations with the exception of some minor items. It is intended to further systematise expenditure by the introduction of a costing system. Care will be taken to see that there is no impairing of efficiency, and that essential services are adequately maintained. It is more difficult to budget income, but your Committee will closely examine contributory schemes. Government action may be taken to bring into being one with compulsory conditions and with Hospital benefits. In the meantime an endeavour will be made to infuse new life into the District quota system, and with the help of public spirited citizens in the various centres, your Committee is sanguine of a hearty response. There are slight indications of a brighter outlook, but the maintenance of a properly equipped and modern Hospital unit is worth an abundance of self sacrifice, and your Committee appeals for a continuance of the loyal and practical support of all citizens, thus enabling it to carry on the work of the institution without financial embarrassment. Gross expenditure was less, and receipts more, thus enabling accounts to be closed with a debit balance of only £283. The average cost per patient and per bed is much lower than last year.

PATIENTS.

The number of patients treated during the year was 1612, comprising 772 males and 840 females, the daily average being 78.49. The number of out-patients who received attention was 1201. In the "Saltau" Memorial Maternity Ward 193 babies were born during the year. The Infectious Wards have been open throughout the year.

HONORARY MEDICAL STAFF.

The Committee again wish to tender their thanks to Drs. J. H. Henderson, H. I. Holmes, F. E. Littlewood, J. F. Patrick, A. E. Brauer, I. Buzzard, C. C. Macknight and E. Bannon for their valuable services. Dr. M. M. Lyons has been elected Hon. Medical Officer for Diseases of the Eye.

RESIDENT MEDICAL OFFICER.

Country Hospitals are experiencing some difficulty in filling the position of Resident Medical Officer. Dr. W. F. Bowen completed his term of service and Dr. Rochlin was appointed. Dr. Rochlin has since resigned and the position is vacant at present.

MATRON AND NURSING STAFF.

Whilst on leave, a very serious accident befall Matron Griffiths, necessitating lengthy leave of absence, during which period Sister Drummond filled the position with general satisfaction. The Matron's return to duty is recorded with pleasure. There have been several changes in the staff. Sister Hance resigned her position as Sister-in-Charge of the Midwifery Ward, and Sister Brooks, Night Sister, was appointed in her stead. Sister R. Keast was appointed Night Sister, but has resigned. Sister A. L. Muir has been appointed to the position. During the year, Nurses J. L. Watt, M. McGregor, M. V. Robinson, O. King and Q. McInnes were successful in passing their R.V.T.N.A. examination. Nurses can now qualify for their Midwifery Certificates, and during the year Nurses D. Bennett, P. B. Westwood, M. W. Mathews and A. Fisher have passed their Midwifery examination.

RETIRING OFFICERS.

Messrs. J. Dickson, J. D. E. Walter and Dr. J. H. Henderson, City Members of Committee retire by effluxion of time, and are eligible for re-election. There is also one vacancy to be filled consequent upon the resignation of Mr. E. H. Shaw. Messrs. D. O'Keefe and Carlos Gordon, Country Members of Committee, also retire and are eligible for re-election. There is also one vacancy for a country member.

RED CROSS HOSPITAL AUXILIARIES.

The Committee desires to express to the members of the various branches of the Hospital Auxiliary their thanks for their self-denying and valuable services. The contributions in cash and kind mean a considerable relief to Hospital expenditure, but in addition the personal services rendered and the interest taken betokens a contribution which cannot be measured in terms of money. The City Auxiliary not only supplied some of the linen requirements, but members have given their services from week to week at the Hospital. Allansford, Dennington, Nullawarre, Grasmere and Wangoom continue to send useful parcels of groceries, jellies, preserved fruits, biscuits, also hot water bags. Dennington branch has again supplied all the crockery needed, and Allansford the cutlery replacements. The Junior Red Cross branches at Mepunga, Mepunga East and Allansford have also made very valuable and regular contributions, including produce from the school gardens and are highly commended for their help. Owing to clashing with Market Day the usual Jam Day was not held, but Allansford sent their usual contribution, and all contributors are heartily thanked. Egg Day once again supplied well over 2000 dozen. In this effort the various schools play a very important part. The same willing helpers were well to the fore, and materially contributed to the success of the appeal. The Committee express their grateful thanks to all who in any way assisted.

EMPLOYEES' CONTRIBUTIONS.

In spite of reduced wages and Unemployment Relief Tax, a number of employees continue their regular contributions, for which the Committee is very grateful. The following have made contributions during the year, viz.— Employees of Nestles, Woolien Mill, Railways, Town Hall (Office and Day Labor), Gasworks, Technical School Staff, Youngers, H. M. Balding (Drivers), Swintons, Cramond & Dickson, Hammond & Sons, Morse Pty. Ltd., W. Flett, Bruce & McClure, A. Donaldson, Warrnambool Standard, Beardsley & Co., Saltau & Son Pty. Ltd., J. Fletcher Jones, State Electricity Commission, Sanitary Employees, and several Bank Staffs.

WOOD APPEAL.

The contribution of wood, organized by Toc H and local committees at Panmure, Nullawarre, Nirranda and Boggy Creek is very much appreciated by the Hospital Committee. A quantity was brought in from Panmure by rail (Toc H being responsible for the freight). This wood was carted from the Railway Station to the Hospital yard, as was also a quantity from the other depots. The thanks of the Committee are given to all those who provided transport, and also for labor and services given in the work of loading and unloading this wood.

QUEEN CARNIVAL AND MARKET DAY.

In order to liquidate the Bank overdraft, a Market Day (April 22) and Queen Carnival was held. There were five Queens, and with strong and enthusiastic committees working a tremendous amount of interest in the Hospital was aroused throughout the city and country districts. The crowning ceremony was held in the Warrnambool Town Hall on Monday, July 10. The hall was packed and very keen interest was taken in the proceedings, especially as the winning Queen was not known until the various amounts were announced at the function. The President, in an appreciative speech, thanked the Queen of Charity and all the Queens and their committees for the excellent work they had done, and entertained them at supper and made appropriate gifts to the Queens. As a result of the Market Day and Queen Competition the Hospital will benefit to the extent of about £1000. The Committee is most grateful for this splendid result, as it shows how the people of both the city and the country are behind the Hospital and never fail to respond to an appeal.

ENTERTAINMENTS.

The amount raised from this source was £355, exclusive of the varied entertainments held in connection with the Queen Carnival. The Progress Association raised £161 from motor car competition. The Annual Hospital Ball yielded £77, the Art and Crafts Society Exhibition £28, Cramond and Dickson Palais £28, Kororoit Ball £12, Kirkstall Ball £12, and Nirranda and Nullawarre Concert £20/16/- . The Hospital Race Meeting was unfortunately run at a loss, but the W.R.C. very generously paid the Hospital £7/9/- received by donations. The Committee deeply appreciates all the unselfish work in organising and conducting these entertainments.

HOSPITAL DRIVE.

This year the Hospital drive was held in the Spring (Nov. 17), instead of the Autumn, and will be held annually at the same time. A large number of voluntary collectors gave their services and £320 was realised.

COUNTRY QUOTAS.

The work of collecting the Country Quotas was somewhat affected by the Queen Carnival. The following districts however have made the usual collections, and the amounts are as follows:—Allansford, £60/16/-; Cudgee, £10/5/-; Dennington (including Nestles), £70/14/3; Framlingham, £25/7/3, Garvoc, £10/5/9; Mailors Flat, £17/11/-; Nirranda, £33/15/-; Nullawaire, £2/8/6; Panmure, £50, extra £15/3/9; Purnim, £50; Southern Cross, £15/1/6; Wangoom, £37/11/6; Woodford and Bushfield, £10/12/-, Koroit, £38/17/3; Yangery, £16/8/-, Grasmere, £41/8/-; Winslow, £4/1/-, Woolsthorpe, £5/16/6. Some of the collections are incomplete, and some are included in the Queen Carnival Competition.

BUILDING FUND, DONATIONS, ETC.

A further payment from the Burden Estate has liquidated the debt balance. McMeekin, although not a member of Committee, was a consistent and valuable worker for the Hospital. To the sorrowing relatives the Committee express their deepest sympathy.

GENERAL.

The Report would not be complete without an acknowledgment of the splendid way in which the "Standard" Pty. Ltd. opens its columns to further the interests of the Hospital. To the many others rendering unseen but valuable services the Committee tenders its thanks.

The House Committee continues its system of visits which have proved to be of great value in the efficient working of the Institution. Many necessary improvements have been effected through their instrumentality. The Finance Committee also have given much valuable time and thought to the finances.
