COMMITTEE'S REPORT.

TO THE LIFE GOVERNORS, ANNUAL GOVERNORS, AND CONTRIBUTORS.

LADIES AND GENTLEMEN,—

Your Committee have pleasure in submitting for your approval their Seventy-eighth Annual Report.

FINANCE.

The matter of Finance is still causing the Committee much anxiety. The gross expenditure was £8,204 being a slight increase over the previous year. The Contributions from town and country are somewhat lower, both no doubt, being due to the depressed state of affairs and the consequent huge army of unemployed. It is pleasing to note, however, that the payments for X-Ray and by Out-patients have nearly doubled. The cost per bed is lower at £105, and is amongst the lowest in the state. All expenditures have been closely examined, but in view of the adverse conditions, the year has closed with a debit balance of £942. In order to check the financial drift economies have been introduced including a reduction of salaries and wages. A Hospital Carnival and Queen Competition has been arranged to take place in March, 1933, when it is hoped that the debit balance will be liquidated. Your Committee confidently anticipates the continued practical help and sympathy of all in the area served by the Hospital in order that the finances may be kept on an even keel.

PATIENTS.

During the year 594 Males and 823 Females were treated, a total of 1427. The Infectious Diseases Hospital has been open all the year, 31 males and 30 females being admitted. The Daily Average has increased to 77.5. In the Maternity Ward 181 babies were born during the period under review. The Hospital is a Registered Training School for Midwifery, thus enabling Nursing Trainees to add this course to their General Training should they so desire.

HONORARY MEDICAL STAFF.

Special thanks are accorded to Doctors J. H. Henderson, H. I. Holmes, F. E. Littlewood, J. F. Patrick, A. E. Brauer, Irving Buzzard and C. C. MacKnight for their self denying services. Dr. E. G. Bannon has been elected a member of the Honorary Medical Staff.

RESIDENT MEDICAL OFFICER.

There has been some difficulty in filling the position of R.M.O. Dr. G. C. V. Thompson filled the position for most of the year and later Dr. W. Fenton Bowen was appointed.

NURSING STAFF.

There have been few changes since last report. Nurses N. Collins, N. V. Harris, B. R. McGregor, F. M. McDonald, D. Bennett, M. Howard, L. McLaren, P. B. Westwood were successful in passing their R.V.T.N.A. Examination and have received Certificates accordingly. Nurses N. V. Harris, A. I. Osmond, F. M. McDonald and B. R. McGregor have passed their Midwifery Examination and have received the extra Certificate.

RETIRING OFFICERS.

Messrs. J. Mainland, F. T. Redford, and M. T. Whiting, City Members of Committee, retire by effluxion of time, and are eligible for re-election. Mr. R. M. Wolfe resigned during the year. Mr. A. D. Randell was elected to fill the vacancy thus caused and is eligible for re-election. Messrs. R. M. Burnie, W. J. Ross, W. Henderson and R. Glasgow, Country Members, retire by effluxion of time and are eligible for re-election.

RED CROSS HOSPITAL AUXILIARY.

The members of the various Auxiliaries continue to give very valuable and practical services to the Hospital. Their contributions include cash donations and many gifts in kind. The City Auxiliary has the supply of linen for its objective. Dennington specialises in Crockery and Allansford in Cutlery. These branches in common with Grasmere, Nullawarre, Wangoom, Woodford and Panmure supply useful quantities of extras such as Hot Water Bags, glasses, biscuits, groceries, jellies, preserved fruits, etc. The Annual Jam Day was again held in the City while Allansford and other centres collected in the country. Egg Day is a wonderful help to the Hospital and well over 2,000 dozen eggs were donated. The many untiring helpers gave willing services in conducting the Egg appeal. To all contributors to these efforts the Committee express their grateful thanks.

WOOD DAY.

Wood Day is now an established effort and the special thanks of the Committee are given to members of Toc H and all who either in the country centres or in Warrnambool have given their services. Owing to the wood, which was cut and stacked by willing helpers and for whom refreshments were kindly provided by the ladies, being rather wet and green it has not all been carted in. About 160 tons was brought from Panmure and with the kind assistance of Mr. J. Timms with his Engine and Saw Bench this has been cut and stacked in the Hospital yard.

EMPLOYEES CONTRIBUTIONS.

The abnormal amount of unemployment and the imposition of Unemployment Relief Tax has adversely affected these contributions. The Committee extend their thanks to all who continue to help in this regular and systematic way. ENTERTAINMENTS.

Entertainments again provided a considerable sum during the year, although the total of £418 was less than last year. Misfortune again attended the Hospital Race Meeting, although the net result was £31, an increase on last year. The Annual Hospital Ball was a great success and yielded £161. To all those responsible for organising and conducting these entertainments the Committee tender their best thanks.

HOSPITAL DRIVE.

The Annual Hospital Drive took place on March 10th, but the result was smaller than last year. A large number of volunteer collectors cheerfully gave their services and to them and all donors the Committee offer their warm appreciation. It is proposed this year to have the Drive in November next, which date it is hoped will better suit all concerned.
