107th ANNUAL REPORT



TO THE LIFE GOVERNORS AND CONTRIBUTORS –

Ladies and Gentlemen,

It is a privilege and pleasure to present the 107th Annual Report of the Committee of Management covering the activities of the Hospital, together with audited financial statements, for the year ended 30th June, 1961.

This year has been one of progress in many departments and steadily and surely we are advancing our progress towards the planned objective of expansion of medical and nursing facilities, improved patients' accommodation and modern auxiliary services to serve our city, district and Corangamite Region.

DEVELOPMENT PLANS:

Plans for multi story building of public wards for adults, surgical and medical and children's ward, have occupied our attention for many years, but we are now able to report that working drawings and specifications are prepared and quantities taken out. Plans have been passed by the Hospital Commission inspectors and the members of the Commission have temporarily withheld authority to call tenders pending finalisation of State finance allocation.

It is anticipated that tenders will be called during August/September. It would then take some six weeks for tangible progress from that date and a small amount of demolition of old sections would be the first activity.

During construction of Stage One of building program Stage Two will be planned comprising operating theatres and central dressings on the first floor to connect with the surgical floor of the multi-storey structure. Casualty department would be constructed on ground floor.

The next major item to receive attention will be the boiler equipment to cope with increased demand and tentative plans are in hand.

CORANGAMITE REGION:

This service has continued in its expansion and fullest co-operation and good-will is evident between district hospitals and Base Hospital.

Valuable equipment of varied type is available on loan from the Base Hospital and especially insulcots for premature babies are constantly being transferred to district hospitals.

The regional co-ordinator has arranged interesting Regional Council meetings quarterly. Senior Hospital Commission officers have visited as guest speakers.

IMPROVED SERVICES:

There has been no spectacular advance in any one section, but many departments have been renovated and modernised.

Private and intermediate section has been screened upon silent plastic tracks to achieve privacy for individual beds. Lighting and power points for wireless are available in all four and three-bed wards. In the same section a relatives' waiting room has been provided.

Pantries and steriliser rooms in public wards have been remodelled.

Ample kitchen refrigeration facilities have been provided including deep freeze room and main kitchen has been re-roofed on an improved design.

Engineers' workshops have been rebuilt and suitably equipped with hand and power tools.

Staff garages have been erected.

Enclosure of extensive ramp leading to male ward to protect patients during transfer.

EQUIPMENT

The replacement of water boiling sterilisers with pressure autoclaves has been at considerable cost but it carries out modern practice of greater patient protection in sterilising methods.

The steam heating system has been expanded to benefit additional sections of mid-wifery floor and T.B. chalet.

Pantries have been modernised with storage space, improved cooking, and modern stainless steel sinks.

New model cars have been purchased for visiting nurse and itinerant physiotherapist.

LAUNDRY

The group laundry and central linen exchange caters for 676 beds in eight hospitals and poundage treated has averaged 62,000 lb dry weight each four weekly period. Constant checks with experts' test figures show marked production efficiency. An additional drying tumbler and washing machine with motor for slow or fast agitation, especially for treatment of all wool shrink resistant blankets, were added during the year. Total cost of £2,873.

An extension has been added to secure additional sorting space for soiled and clean linen and also to provide garage accommodation for laundry delivery vehicle at a cost of £3,355. The Hospitals' Commission met the major part of this cost.

Miss I. Jenkins, who had occupied the position of head laundress for 19 years and latterly as linen exchange supervisor, retired from duty upon long service leave. Mr. J. Chapman, machine operator, is absent on long service leave.

NURSE TRAINING

Tenders are let for renovations which will improve lecturing facilities for general nurse training school.

A block system of study has been introduced to streamline training methods. An additional quiet study room has been built.

Corangamite Nurse Aide Training School has been established to cater for the needs of Corangamite Regional Hospitals and Portland. Other regional hospitals may be affiliated at a later date. The school has been prepared by renovation of existing rooms and now

consists of lecture room, three demonstration rooms (ward sterilising utility), library and study room. Living-in accommodation is available for up to eight students.

Training period is twelve months, being six weeks in training school concentrating on theory and 10½ months practical in the students' affiliated training school.

It is planned to hold six schools annually, each of approximately eight students. Sister A. Haddow, deputy matron of the Base Hospital, was appointed sister tutor to the new school.

CARE OF THE AGED

The aged and aged sick are our pioneers and worthy of our greatest efforts for their welfare but accommodation presents an increasing problem.

Accommodation at Alveston, Corio and Wards 4 and 5 at the Base Hospital, each for the especial care of our aged, totals 107 beds, but it is inadequate for the Corangamite Region needs, and the wards of the hospitals have to accommodate many patients in this category. The staffs at Alveston and Corio, headed by Matrons E. Smith and M. Hammond respectively, and staff of Wards 4 and 5, are unsparing in time and effort to give happiness and contentment to their patients.

Outstanding in practical support and good-will are the members of Fletcher Jones and Staff Pty. Ltd., for personal visits and comforts, and also finance for construction. The system of weekly personal contributions from pay envelopes has been maintained most generously and fortnightly visits have been made to give comfort and assistance to patients, as many of them have no relatives to visit them.

Rotary Club and church organisations have greatly assisted with cheery visits and welcome gifts both for individuals and for general use. The church organisations ensured the success of the Corio fete during May, with efficient organising and generous willing help.

Apex Club held a voluntary working bee and painted the roof of Alveston Home, thus greatly improving the exterior appearance.

Each Home has received improvement in service by increasing refrigeration, heating of wards, cooking equipment, exterior and interior painting.

AUXILIARIES

It is heartening to record the sterling assistance from auxiliary groups who have been most willing, energetic and whole-hearted in joining in the organised care of the sick.

Through this support, valuable and much-needed equipment has been secured which will prove of inestimable benefit to patients' welfare over future years of hospital service.

The following is a very brief precis giving little indication of effort, but is recorded as a mark of appreciation. In alphabetical order:—

Caramut: This auxiliary has again shown that a small membership can do a large amount of work. Main functions were street stall, and organisation for 3YB Concert Party visit. The donation of £84 purchased new sterilising equipment for male ward.

Office-bearers: President, Mrs. A. Hassell; Secretary, Mrs. J. McCully.

Dennington: This hard-working auxiliary provided £200 from card functions, entertainments, stalls and canvass for direct giving. This permitted purchase of two electric suckers, and geriatric equipment for our aged patients.

Office-bearers: President, Mrs. R. Barton; Secretary, Mrs. A. G. Lumsden.

Grasmere-Cooramook: This young auxiliary has concentrated its efforts on direct giving and systematically canvasses its district with the excellent result of £105.

Office-bearers: President, Mrs. A. Crothers; Secretary, Mrs. J. Henderson.

Hawkesdale: As in past years, effort was consolidated into the Paddy's Market held in Warrnambool in September. Good organising and generous support realised a substantial total and £306 was donated to provide, with the assistance of Government subsidy, 16 special bassinets for midwifery floor and also Christmas cheer for patients.

Office-bearers: President, Mrs. K. Whitehead; Secretary, Mrs. R. V. Whitehead.

Naringal: A branch small in numbers, but whose effort in stalls and card evenings is wholehearted. Amount raised, £52/10/-, devoted to patients' walking frames, also individual fruit baskets in public wards.

Office-bearers: Secretary and Treasurer, Mrs. A. Chislett.

Nullawarre-Nirranda-Mepunga: Two major efforts produced £209/10/0 for the annual effort. A well organised and enjoyable house party at Nullawarre raised £98 and the members formed themselves into a united group for a combined district direct collection realising the excellent total of £111/10/-. The following equipment was secured — two electric suckers, rubber mattress, ward heating for Alveston and Corio Homes and operating theatre equipment.

Office-bearers: President, Mrs. J. Lynes; Secretary, Mrs. L. Burleigh.

Purnim-Framlingham-Ballangeich: The members of this auxiliary have again had a successful year, realising £95 from street stalls and proceeds of 3YB Radio Concert at Purnim. This has enabled the purchase of chrome wheel chair for patients for transfer to X-ray, etc., an autoclave for sterilising instruments, and nurses' training equipment.

Office-bearers: President, Mrs. A. G. Fenton; Secretary, Miss A. Campbell.

Warrnambool Ladies: As is the usual custom concentration was upon weekly linen sewing activity and a large number of varied items were manufactured. In addition £75 was presented for purchase of geriatric equipment and Christmas cheer and additional items yet to be decided.

Office-bearers: President, Mrs. D. Dawson; Secretary, Miss L. Mack.

Warrnambool Junior Ladies: A well-planned year of activity has provided a full program of varied functions and the members have given loyal support to their office-bearers and worked consistently and effectively. This is shown by the year's net credit balance of £611/7/3, which was all presented to the hospital as equipment needs were made apparent. These included—Electric fans (mid. floor), E.P.N.S. ware for public female and male patients, stainless steel sink, operating theatre instruments, Jill and Johnnie booklets for children's ward. The main source of income was a fete in Warrnambool in November.

Office-bearers: President, Mrs. F. Williams; Secretary, Mrs. A. Hooton.

Warrnambool Hospital Past Trainees: A fete and individual functions were the main activities of this active auxiliary and £85/9/- was donated ex funds to purchase sun blinds on Ward 4 and D.S.L. steriliser for installation in female public ward. The reunion dinner, attended by 96 past trainees and guests, was held in the hospital.

Office-bearers: President, Mrs. D. McD. Taylor; Secretary, Mrs. I. Bruce.

Warrnambool Base Hospital Auxiliary: Activities recorded in Appeal.

Woolsthorpe: This auxiliary was unable to conduct a major function this year but is planning ahead for later 1961 or early 1962.

President: Mrs. J. A. Affleck.

HOSPITAL AND CHARITIES COMMISSION: Appreciation is expressed for the assistance given by Dr. J. H. Lindell, Chairman, Commissioners and administrative staff during the year. Great problems confront the Commission and the sympathetic co-operation and support in our local requirements is greatly appreciated.

COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT: During the year the committee regretfully accepted the resignation of Mr. F. H. Ford during the second year of his term as president as he was leaving Warrnambool to reside in Ballarat. Mr. Ford, who had been an active and prominent member for 16 years, had given inestimable value in terms of service as president, treasurer, sub-committee chairman, and his sound advice was greatly missed.

Mr. R. G. Bennett, Senior Vice President, was appointed president for the balance of the term.

The following members retire by effluxion of time or by By-law 31, but are eligible for re-election: Messrs. R. V. Philpott, J. McD. Taylor, A. W. Lewis, Bruce Auty.

SPECIALISTS' DEPARTMENTS: This City and district is fortunate to be served by such up-to-the-minute technical services in the scientific art of medicine, and public confidence is expressed in terms of increasing volume and scope of examinations to an ever-widening district. Dr. J. D. Reid (Pathology) and Dr. A. T. Park (Radiology) control departments which have expanded services beyond expectations.

During the year the Pathology Department was registered as a training school for pathological technicians.

Physiotherapy and pharmacy have also increased in service rendered.

Blood bank maintains a high standard and a drive for donors assisted by Junior Chamber of Commerce has built up the voluntary donors' lists to over 1000 donors.

District hospitals and industries as well as many private citizens have been most helpful in this life-saving service.

Additional consultative clinics — notably eye and also ear, nose and throat are now available to the Corangamite Region by visiting specialists. Regular visits by Peter McCallum Clinic and Poliomyelitis Council are still available by appointment.

Mortuary facilities have been greatly improved to assist post mortem examinations. Facilities for clinical photography were organised as a further medical advance.

STATISTICS AND FINANCE: This information is available elsewhere in this report drawing attention to a year of service in terms of patients treated and essential expenses caused thereby.

VOLUNTARY SERVICES: Honorary medical and dental staffs give skilled attention and generous service at considerable personal sacrifice and without monetary reward. Congratulations are extended to Dr. W. R. Beetham, who gained the qualification of F.R.A.C.S., also to Dr. H. J. Barbour, who passed Diploma of Anaesthesia.

Honorary optometrists gave unsparing service of both time and personal expense to provide spectacles to aged and indigent patients at the Base and Annex Homes.

School children's support through social service groups has been heartening, especially during Egg Appeal and Radio Appeal. The regular attendance of about 15 High School students on a roster each week to provide assistance at the Base, Alveston and Corio, is greatly appreciated.

Red Cross Library and Red Cross Diversional Therapy Group lessen the tedium of long-stay patients.

Nestanglo Social Club and Warrnambool Fire Brigade maintained the spirit of Christmas and good will in our wards. Rotary Club members continue their kindly visits and gifts on birthdays to many who would otherwise have no relatives to mark the occasion. Church groups of all denominations have been most attentive in spreading cheer and comfort to patients.

NURSING: Matron D. A. Swinton, assisted by Miss A. Haddow, deputy matron, and charge sisters, have maintained a high standard of nursing care, and with constant study keep in touch with changing methods of treatment in the nursing profession.

It was very gratifying that the Hospital Staff Auxiliary candidate was successful in raising the largest sum in the "Darby and Joan" competition in 1961, after being second in 1960 with the total of £2877/6/-.

This committee offers congratulations to the Staff Auxiliary on its enthusiasm, initiative, and novel ideas for fund-raising.

Many firms and individuals also contributed generously direct to the appeal.

MANAGER & SECRETARY: The Board of Management wishes to record its unreserved appreciation and complete support to our Manager and Secretary, Mr. S. A. Lindsay. Over recent years our expanding programme, the growth of the Regional Scheme and administration of Alveston and Corio have made the program of Mr. Lindsay very heavy and our special thanks are due to him for the most efficient, untiring and courteous manner in which these tasks have been carried out.

STAFF: Dr. R. H. Laurence has contributed a year of competent service as senior resident medical officer. Dr. F. R. Braithwaite completed his two-year contract in February and was succeeded by Dr. J. Galati of Melbourne as junior resident medical officer.

Mr. W. I. Layther, Assistant Manager, and Mr. A. Matthews, accountant, gave valuable aid to administration and freely gave personal time in the interest of the hospital.

CONCLUSION: Each year has its highlights, and the spirit of 1961 has been indicative of whole-hearted co-operation and community self help towards the hospital.

A report such as this can merely touch in precis form upon a multitude of public aids showing the sincere regard of the well towards the sick and aged.

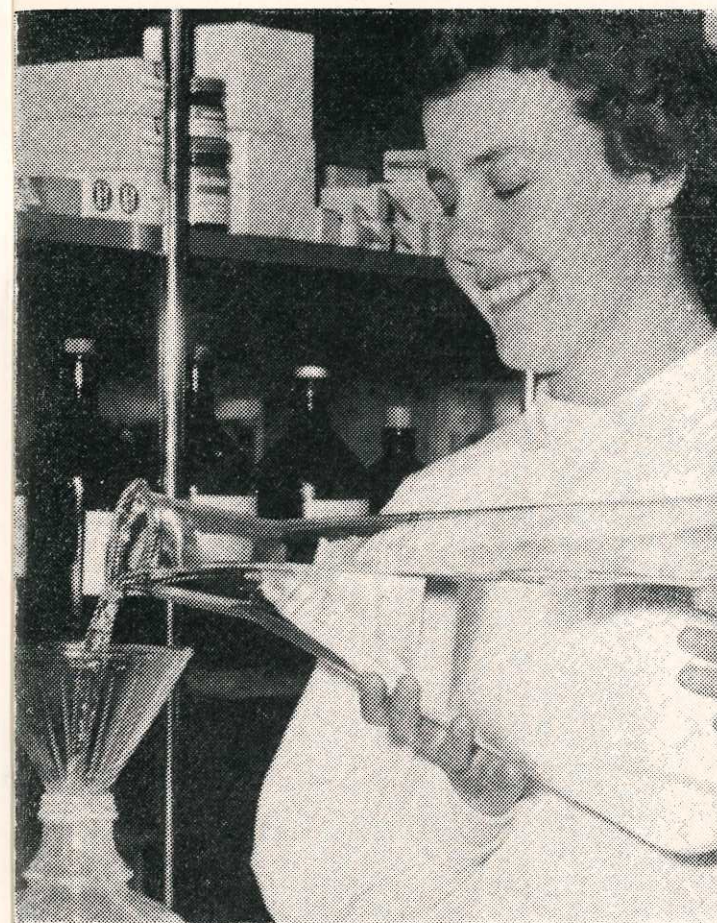
Good public relations are sponsored by our main mediums, the Warrnambool Standard and 3YB Radio, who fairly and with a generosity of space presented our activities to those we serve.

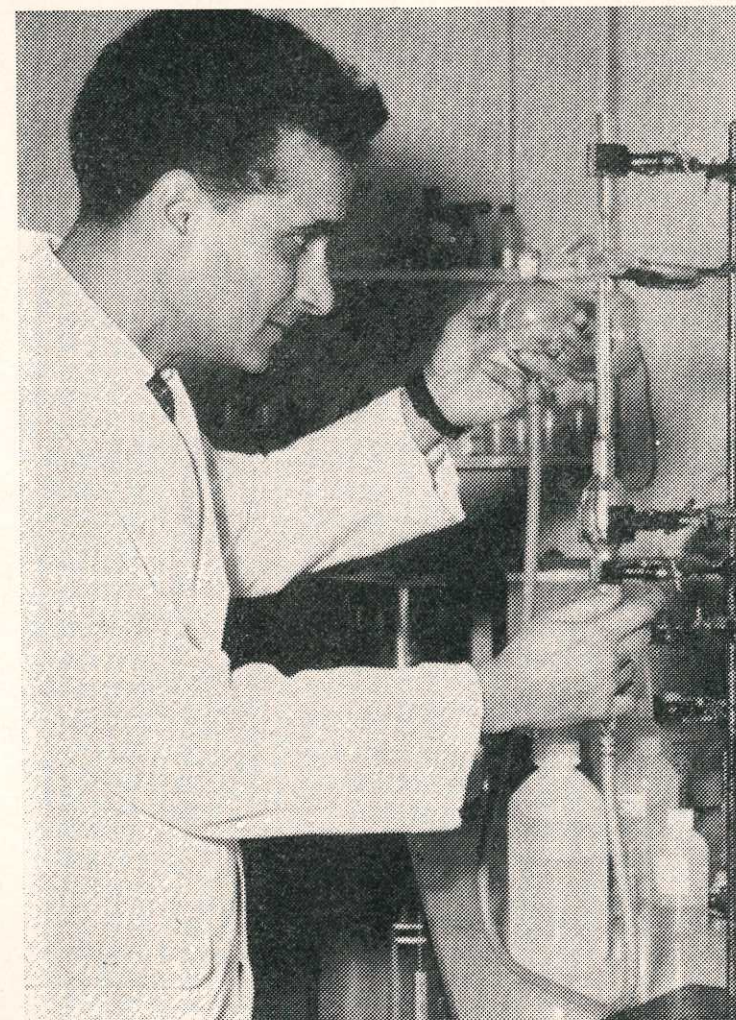
